Dear Parents and carers,

I am writing about our school uniform policy. We have endeavoured to have a school uniform policy which is as cost effective as possible in the current economic climate; however we have noticed an increasing number of children attending school in clothes that are clearly not in line with this policy. Please can you ensure that your children attend school in appropriate uniform.

Uniform:

- Dark grey or black school skirt, school pinafore or school trousers
- A plain white polo shirt
- A royal blue cardigan or jumper (if you wish to buy one with a logo these are available from school or plain ones are available from supermarkets)
- Nursery only – royal blue tracksuit bottoms
- For children who wear turbans or headscarves, these should be plain grey, black or royal blue.
- No jewellery. Where children have pierced ears, they should wear small, plain studs. Hoops can be pulled or caught during play and should not be worn. Children can wear a plain analogue or digital watch, but smart watches are not permitted.

PE kit is provided by the school and children simply need to bring trainers on their PE day.

If you are struggling to provide uniform due to financial circumstances please come and speak to Lucy Ennis, Alison Hyde or Mandy Stevenson. We would never want parents to feel that they have to choose between providing uniform and paying bills and that is why all of uniform can be purchased at minimum cost from supermarkets. However, we are seeing children in school in completely inappropriate clothing for school including: branded sportswear, sequinned leggings and patterned trousers.

From Monday, I am looking forward to seeing all of our children wearing their uniform with pride.
